Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2020-2021 is **(£18,590 plus £7922.50 carried forward) £26,512.50**. The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.
